Dear Parents/Carers,

We would like to encourage parents to use the feedback page on the school website. Please use it to tell us how we are doing and how we can make Fleetville Junior School an even better school for our children.

You may have read or heard about a new government initiative called the Home Access Grant. It entitles families on low income to a **free computer and internet access**. To qualify for this generous package you must either be claiming free school meals or one or more of a set of benefits:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit) and an income of less than £16,040
- Guaranteed Pension Credit
- Income Related Employment Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act

To make your claim you should phone 0333 200 1004. You will then be sent an application form to complete. If you would like some support in filling in the form, please speak to one of the office staff who will be pleased to help you. This is a first come, first served 'offer' so act quickly!

Hertfordshire County Council is running a consultation on the proposed admissions arrangements for the school year 2011/12 and is seeking responses from parents/carers, schools and community groups.

The consultation includes a proposal to move from the 'shortest designated route' method of measuring home-school distances for admission purposes to 'straight line distance' measurement. The consultation period runs until 26 February 2010.
